

**PERS Table of Service Credit Rules – Active Members**

This chart explains how service credit is earned in an eligible position. For additional information, refer to Chapter 3 of the *DRS Employer Handbook*. This chart does not apply to Elected Officials.

<p><b>On or after September 1, 1991</b></p> <p><i>A member employed in an eligible position earns service credit as follows:</i></p> <p>70 hours or more of compensation in a month = one month of service credit</p> <p>Some compensation, but less than 70 hours in a month = 1/4 month of service credit</p>	<p><b>On or after September 1, 1991</b></p> <p><i>A member employed in an eligible position earns service credit as follows:</i></p> <p>90 hours or more of compensation in a month = one month of service credit</p> <p>At least 70 hours but less than 90 hours of compensation in a month = 1/2 month of service credit</p> <p>Some compensation, but less than 70 hours in a month = 1/4 month of service credit</p>
<p><b>Prior to September 1, 1991</b></p> <p><i>A member employed in an eligible position earned service credit as follows:</i></p> <p>70 hours or more of compensation in a month = one month of service credit</p> <p>Some compensation but less than 70 hours in a month = 0 service credit</p>	<p><b>Prior to September 1, 1991</b></p> <p><i>A member employed in an eligible position earned service credit as follows:</i></p> <p>90 hours or more of compensation in a month = one month of service credit</p> <p>Some compensation, but less than 90 hours in a month = 0 service credit</p>
