15 This matter having come on regularly before the above-entitled court pursuant to Plaintiffs
16 motion for a temporary restraining order of the Washington Federation of State Employees; the
17 plaintiffs appearing by and through its attorneys of record; the defendant, State of Washington,
18 appearing by and through, Shawn Horlacher, Assistant Attorney General; and the
19 Defendant Freedom Foundation ^{NOT} ~~appearing by and through its attorney~~ ^{w/o argument}
20 plaintiff's counsel having provided notice to the Attorney General's Office and the Freedom Foundation
21 of the intention to seek the relief sought herein and the basis therefor; the court having considered the
22 complaint and the declarations of Leanne Kunze and Kent Stanford, and being otherwise fully advised
in the premises, and believing that the requested relief is proper in the premises, and that specifically a

1 temporary restraining order is appropriate as it appears that release of certain information requested by
 2 the Freedom Foundation concerning employees of the State of Washington may seriously endanger at
 3 least some of those employees; and that unless the defendant is restrained, there is the immediate
 4 danger of irreparable physical injury to those employees from others facilitated by the release of such
 5 information; now, therefore, it is hereby


6 ORDERED that the State of Washington and the named agencies and institutions be and
 7 hereby are ordered to appear before the presiding judge of the above-entitled court on Friday, the 27
 8 day of December, 20 19 at 9 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, then and there
 9 to show cause, if any they may have, why it should not be enjoined, pending these proceedings, from
 10 releasing employees' names, birthdates, duty station/location and work email pursuant to any request
 11 for the same by the Freedom Foundation; and it is further

12 ORDERED that pending the hearing, the State of Washington and the named agencies and
 13 institutions be and they hereby are restrained pending further order of the court from releasing
 14 employees' names, birthdates, duty station/location and work email pursuant to any request for the
 15 same by the Freedom Foundation; and it is further

16 ORDERED that bond be set in the amount of \$ _____ in the form of an unsecured promise to
 17 pay by the plaintiffs.

18 **FAILURE ON THE DEFENDANT'S PART TO APPEAR AND SHOW CAUSE AT**
 19 **THE ABOVE-ENTITLED DATE AND TIME WILL RESULT IN ENTRY OF AN**
 20 **ORDER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS HEREIN.**
